Then come to the **Alberton Senior Center on Thursday, May 12 at 7 p.m**. to hear a free talk from Dr. Erick Green. He will explain studies that show animals convey a fantastic amount of information with their many vocalizations.

Ninemile Ranger District Public Meeting

Tuesday, May 17, 2016 at 6:30 p.m.- Nine Mile Community Center

Come hear an update from the Forest Service about ongoing and future projects on the Ninemile Ranger District, including a new project that will look at fire risk reduction treatments on the National Forest between Soldier Creek and Butler Creek. Although they've only just begun on this project, learn what they know so far, hear about the timeline, and what managers are considering thus far. They'll also be available to talk about stream restoration work in the Ninemile Valley done in partnership with Trout Unlimited, prescribed burning activities for this spring and fall, and some planned recreation events. Several resource specialists and the District Ranger will be present. The format will begin with some brief presentations and introductions, with plenty of time for more detailed one on one discussions with the staff and Ranger.
