NMCC BYLAWS CHANGES PASSED AT THE SEPTEMBER ELECTION New Community Center Board Members Start Their Terms

At our September 2020 election, the Board of Directors proposed an expansion of the community center membership area to include all of the 59846 zip code, adding western Huson, all Six Mile residents, and neighborhoods south of I-90. For many years the Board recognized that our "community" actually included many people who regularly participated and contributed to NMCC events. The Bylaws changes were supported by a wide majority and approved by the voting members.

Local community volunteers were voted in for three year terms on the Board of Directors; Ananda Beauchamp, Lisa Hensley, and Steve King. The big news is that long time Holiday Fair volunteer, Shannon Stalpaert from the Big Horn neighborhood south of I-90, was also voted in by the Board after the Bylaws change. She filled Morris Eisert's vacated position on the Board through the end of 2021. Thanks to Morris and Kristi Eisert for many years of support in our valley. Shannon is our first new Board member from the expanded 59846 membership area! Welcome Shannon and thanks to all who participated in the 2020 election.

Plans for the Future: Our next major project is to complete our boundary fence along the southeast property line and to plant native shrubs opposite the Stark School entrance on the Ninemile Road frontage. That will finish a multi-year project to fence and landscape the community center's 2.51 acre property perimeter. We have applied for a project grant and will know more about our funding later this winter. More info will be coming on opportunities to help with landscaping and fencing as the project develops.









2021 NINE MILE VALLEY HISTORIC PHOTO PROJECT

The Nine Mile Community Center is planning a new 2021 project to create a permanent historical photo exhibit at the Stark Schoolhouse. This will be a local effort to seek out, preserve, and display historic photographs of our Stark Schoolhouse and its rural surrounding in the Nine Mile valley.

The Board was inspired to create this photo exhibit after working on our 2020 historic building restoration. We wanted to display the actual historic photos that were used to guide the exterior paint restoration. When the Board talked about it, we realized this could be a great opportunity to include the entire neighborhood in our photo quest. We want to tell a picture story of the evolution of the Stark School from its beginning in 1915 as a rustic school building into our present day rural community center. You can help.

Some of you may have a wealth of old photos or personal records related to the community center. Old snapshots of dances, school outings, weddings, religious gatherings, and community celebrations at the Center are what we are after. We would also like photos of local industry, logging, mining, branding, and equestrian events. Nine Mile photos that your Granny gave you could be treasure for our project. We

hope to gather photos of both the interior and exterior of our schoolhouse, and also the people of the valley illustrating local styles, vintage vehicles, and our rural community activities through the years.

Please go through your old photo albums this winter and plan to lend us a few of your best photos (or slides/negatives) when we are ready to borrow them next spring. When the date arrives we will pick them up, scan them into digital format, and promptly return them to you. We want people to feel a part of this project by either sharing photos or donating funds to help make it happen. The project is scalable depending on money raised, so any donations will be used for actual production of photo prints. The community center was recently awarded funding to start this project through a Preserving Missoula County's History Grant sponsored by the Historical Museum at Fort Missoula.

Truth is, without you this year has been a struggle both emotionally and financially. We all are feeling it. While we completed several worthwhile projects funded by generous grants and donations, it turns out painting old buildings is nothing like a bustling Apple Cider Festival or Holiday Fair to raise our spirits.

Last year we welcomed more than 450 people to the Holiday Fair. This year, for the safety of our neighbors and vendors, the Holiday Fair was canceled. Our total revenue for all 2020 events was about \$300. Ouch!
